

The European Union and the EU member-states' embassies in Cambodia organized in Phnom Penh last week a banquet to welcome the 61st Anniversary of European Union-Cambodia Relationship and Cooperation (1950-2011).

It was attended by Mr. David Lipman, EU Ambassador and President of EU Delegation to Cambodia; H.E. Sok An, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister in charge of the Office of the Council of Ministers of Cambodia; the EU ambassadors and more than 300 representatives from the United Nations, the international agencies and civil societies and members of the Royal Government of Cambodia.
