



STATEMENT OF THE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION OF CAMBODIA

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Thailand issued statement No. 9/2011 dated 22 April 2011 and 9/2011/20 dated 22 April 2011 as well as a Statement dated 23 April 2011, claiming that Cambodia acted unprovoked against Thailand on 22 April 2011.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of the Kingdom of Cambodia, categorically rejects the above statements and the allegation which is aimed at misleading the public opinion.

The allegations mentioned in the above documents is not involved in any dispute or aggression against Cambodia, which started in the early hours of 22 and 23 April 2011.

From an all sides, in 1941, The armed forces launched a force against Thailand in Cambodia territory at Thmor Thmor area, with the support of thousands of monks of Thai religion. Consequently, The armed forces fired hundreds of heavy weapons into the heavily populated village of Bok Mea, Chhney Apol District, Udon Province, causing thousands of injuries to the Thai people.

After several days, in 1941, The forces provided the area of Thmor Thmor with heavy gunfire, before the soldiers forces pushed ahead with force until a 100-mile radius over the Thmor Thmor of Cambodia.

It should be noted that Thailand has, until now, not yet arranged the deal Terms of Reference for the Department of the International Relations, which could have helped to prevent further actions of the Cambodia-Thailand border. Cambodia, who will, the peace in response of the Thai THOR has been already after its evidence to accommodate Thailand's position.
